The Salvation Army: A 15-Year Partnership

Garden Street Center's Family Emergency Shelter - "With a hand up, not a hand out."

For more than 15 years, Kerry's Kids has partnered with The Salvation Army to provide free health care for the children who are staying in the shelter. When disaster strikes, The Salvation Army puts individuals and families back on solid ground. Whether it's a family on the street, an individual without food, or a community after a disaster, The Salvation Army is committed to rebuilding strength. Through their Family Emergency Shelter, which has 16 rooms and 84 beds, families are able to stay together during times of crisis and are provided with structured programs and an opportunity to live in a safe place. The Salvation Army provides access to social service programs, including help finding more permanent housing and employment.

In addition to these services, this site is also a designated disaster relief site for the Alameda County Office of Emergency and Disaster Services, which is prepared to provide shelter and food throughout the East Bay in the event of a large scale disaster.

Thank you to the volunteer doctors and dentist that make it possible for us to provide health care for the children at the shelter. **Carol Miller, MD** works at University of California, San Francisco and has been volunteering with Kerry's Kids for more than five years. She enjoys talking with the children and being able to answer a variety of questions that the parents have about health concerns, their child's development, behavior questions, and so much more. Dr. Miller says, "Providing a service to families during vulnerable and challenging times in their lives has been a fulfilling and heartwarming experience; I look forward to each clinic session eagerly. Working with an amazing team of staff and other providers is an added joy!"

Sarah Postma, MD (right) works at Hayward's Silva clinic and at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland. She volunteers with Kerry's Kids because "I believe that every child should have the opportunity for a healthy life and access to good medical care. I enjoy working at The Salvation Army clinic because getting to the doctor can be difficult with everything else going on in their families' lives. The simple solution? Bring the doctor to them! I love spending as much time as needed with each family and getting to know the amazing people that they are. I have learned so much from them and hope to continue serving them for many years to come."

Many of the parents of the children she has worked with through Kerry's Kids do not have dental insurance themselves or have not seen a dentist in five or more years, and are eager to ask her questions about their own dental concerns.

Asthma Camp Continues

Camp Breathe Easy is a 4-day, 3-night summer camp for children aged 8-12 living with asthma. In August 2014, Camp was held at Camp Arroyo in Livermore, California. Camp Breathe Easy provides children with asthma an opportunity to attend an overnight summer camp - an experience that may not otherwise be available to them. The program includes traditional camp activities as well as educational sessions on living with asthma.

Camp Breathe Easy is led by a team of highly qualified staff who are committed to children having a safe and fun camp experience. Medical services are supported by Kerry's Kids, allowing for 24 hour on-site medical coverage by doctors, nurses, and other medical personnel. This year, five physicians who work at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland, five pediatric residents, and five nurses provided medical care at the Asthma Camp for 69 campers. Most of the campers were from Alameda County, with a number from Contra Costa County as well.



This year, camp featured a ropes course, horseback riding, capoeira classes, swimming, art projects, gardening, and many other fun activities. The Asthma Carnival allowed campers to show off their newly acquired asthma knowledge, while winning prizes and having fun! To cap off their exciting stay at camp, campers worked in teams to produce acts for the Camp Breathe Easy talent show.
